2.2	Tracey Walton and Karen Dures gave a presentation on the proposed new plans for an early help social care service.	
	We had break out rooms where people were asked to discuss the new service and what it should and shouldn't include.	
2.3	Feedback received from the breakout rooms sessions in the Forum about the new service were:	
	<ul> <li>information should be presented visually</li> <li>based on individual need</li> <li>include training and employment support</li> <li>help users access their local community</li> </ul>	

	<ul> <li>assistance to complete forms</li> <li>support around Mental Health</li> <li>employment and training opportunities</li> <li>Advocacy support should be available for people who need it.</li> <li>Access to the service should be based on individual need</li> <li>There should be one point of contact to find out any information about the service.</li> </ul>

Agenda Item 3	Update on Diagnostic Waiting times	Action and Due Date
3.1	Tracey Walton gave us an update on the Diagnostic waiting times for services in Norfolk and Waveney.	
	Tracey Walton advised that she is responsible for commissioning the Norfolk adult autism diagnostic service, and asked for those in the room with responsibility for adults in Waveney or children and young people to answer any questions or that she was happy to take questions away that she was unable to answer and provide an response for the next meeting.	
3.2	In Norfolk there are two neurodevelopmental teams:	
	<ul> <li>Norfolk Community Heath and Care covers Norfolk.</li> <li>Newberry clinic covers east Norfolk and Waveney.</li> </ul>	
	Clare Angel, is the commissioning lead for these services and is part of the Integrated Care Board	
3.3	Norfolk Community Heath and Care	
	As of 16 <sup>th</sup> November 2022	

	<ul> <li>4487 children are waiting on an assessment.</li> <li>895 are under 6 years.</li> <li>840 on ASD Pathway only</li> <li>38 % are waiting in excess of 2 years / 25% waiting 1-2 years</li> </ul>	
	The Newberry Clinic (James Paget Hospital)	
	Between November 2021 and November 2022 1756 referred into service there have been 450 completed assessment.	
	<ul> <li>462 waiting and assessment</li> <li>761 waiting for initial appointment (average 16 month wait)</li> <li>72 people added to the waits each month</li> </ul>	
3.4	Pre and Post Support Starfish and Starfish Plus.	
	Starfish can offer support to those who are on the waiting list and after diagnosis.	
	Their support and interventions try to:	
	<ul> <li>reduce emerging and established mental health and wellbeing difficulties</li> <li>reduces distressed behaviours</li> <li>reduces attachment and trauma</li> <li>reduces anxiety</li> <li>reduces self-injurious behaviours / harming other</li> <li>increases self-esteem</li> <li>manage emerging social relationship and</li> </ul>	
3.5	sexuality safety.  Autism Service Norfolk, a core commissioned service covers Norfolk. The population of Waveney is covered by a spot purchase arrangement	
3.6	Autism Service Norfolk received 969 referrals in the past year.	
	860 Adults and waiting for an assessment and 66 adults are added to the waiting list each month.	
	Between December 2021 and November 2022 878 people were removed from the waiting list	
	<ul> <li>771 completed assessments</li> <li>174 Autism Service Norfolk</li> <li>597 Independent Providers</li> </ul>	

	<ul> <li>107 removed from the waiting list (possible reasons: no longer waiting an assessment/ paid for a private provided)</li> </ul>	
3.7	Autism Service Norfolk offers a post diagnostic support package that is available up to 12 months after diagnosis.	
3.8	Spot contract in Waveney received 56 referrals into the service. 27 of these were accepted.	
	Currently no one is on the waiting list	
3.9	Question	
	Is there a triage system for referrals? Is there a priority assessment process?	
	Answer	
	Following referral into Autism Service Norfolk and the screening tools resulting in a measure of autism, people are added to the waiting list. Autism Service Norfolk offers those waiting the longest an assessment. However, if people feel they are a priority for assessment for example breakdown in service, relationship or employment they are encouraged to see their GP for a priority autism assessment. At this point and if the GP is in agreement, the GP writes to ASN for a priority assessment.	
3.10	2 million pounds with of funding has been made available to help waiting list in Norfolk and Waveney.	
	For children and young people a new service is being procured with a mobilisation date roughly April '23	
	This service will focus on three age groups 0-7yrs / 8-14yrs / 14-18yrs.	
	Adults share of funding was used to commission external diagnostic providers and is in place until March 2023.
